

Black Arts Funding Summit

Join Grantmakers in the Arts on Dec. 13 for the Black Arts Funding Summit! Grant programs like NEA Jazz Masters and Advancing Black Arts in Pittsburgh continue to thrive amidst decades of challenges both inside and outside of their respective foundations. Across most of the philanthropic field, funders and foundations often fail to acknowledge and reconcile their long histories of exclusion, disenfranchisement and disendowing. This summit asks the question: Beyond the 'difficult conversations' and 'good intentions,' how can institutional grantmaking dollars be used to actively go about change at every level?
