Innovative Approaches to Literacy Program

The US Department of Education has released a notice inviting applications for the **Innovative Approaches to Literacy** (IAL). The IAL program supports highquality programs designed to develop and improve literacy skills for children and students from birth through twelfth grade in high-need local education agencies and schools.

The deadline for notice of intent to apply is **March 29**, and applications are due by **May 15**.

Call for Accelerator Prize Application Reviewers

The Lewis Prize for Music is seeking **reviewers for its Accelerator Prize**. The Review Team is a robust group of about 30 young adults and seasoned professionals who have professional experience in music, Creative Youth Development, systems change, nonprofits and philanthropy.

Applications are due April 11.

Survey on Arts Education and Artificial Intelligence

The Washington Art Education Association seeks input from all circles of influence in education and the general public regarding the status of **arts education and artificial intelligence** — nationally and internationally. This is the fifth qualitative survey conducted since the COVID-19 pandemic began to determine the impact on arts education access, inclusion, instruction and staffing in the basic education arts subjects that include dance, media arts, music, theatre, and visual arts.

The survey closes March 31.

The Wallace Foundation recently published **Skills for Success**: Developing Social and Emotional Competencies in Out-of-School-Time Programs. Funding Opportunities for Community-Based Alternatives to Youth Incarceration

The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention is seeking funding applications for **Community-Based Alternatives to Youth Incarceration**. Funding will support jurisdictions in a community-driven consultation and justice reinvestment planning process that leverages the expertise of staff, representatives from impacted communities, community-based service providers, local foundations, and other key stakeholders to help close and repurpose youth detention and correctional facilities.
