New Framework: Activating Arts Learning

Arts Ed Collaborative, based in southwestern Pennsylvania, recently released Activating Arts Learning: A Theory of Change. The framework, created in collaboration with educators, artists, funders, young people and other stakeholder groups, shows how arts learning can transform young people's lives and outlines supports to activate arts learning.

NASAA Publishes Tools to Explore State Arts Agency Revenues

The National Assembly of State Arts Agencies released a new **report** and **interactive dashboards** to detail legislative appropriations and revenues to state arts agencies. These tools invite users to discover trends and explore regional comparisons.

Ingenuity Releases Data Snapshot on Arts Education Access in Chicago Public Schools



Last month, Chicago-based Ingenuity released its first data snapshot, an expanded analysis that takes a closer look at information collected from the Creative School Survey and other sources. These snapshots complement Ingenuity's State of the Arts in Chicago Public Schools reports by expanding the story behind the data.

Applications Open for Connected Arts Networks Teacher Leaders Program – Music and Visual Arts

Connected Arts Networks is a five-year project designed to engage arts educators in nationwide virtual professional learning communities. The National Art Education Association (NAEA) and National Association for Music Education (NAfME) are seeking PK-12 visual arts, design, media arts and music educators to participate in this program. **Applications** for visual arts are due on **March 14**, and **applications** for music are due on **March 15**.

Professional Development Scholarships for Dance Educators

The National Dance Education Organization (NDEO) is offering 28 professional development scholarships to help dance educators achieve their career goals. Each recipient will receive \$600 and a complimentary one-year membership with NDEO. Dance educators working in schools, private studios, higher education, arts organizations and other settings are eligible to apply. Applications are due on April 30.



New Report: Is Your State Prioritizing Students'

Social, Emotional and Academic Development?

The Education Trust and CASEL's **new report** provides a scan of state policies to support equitable social, emotional and academic development. Readers can explore an overview of policies related to discipline; professional development; rigorous and culturally sustaining curriculum; student, family and community engagement; and wraparound services, as well as see individual state details and compare two states.

Smithsonian Institution Resources Engage Educators and Students in Diverse and Inclusive Learning

The Smithsonian's new Folkways Learning Pathways are free, multidisciplinary lesson plans for K-12 educators that focus on music to explore cultural, historical and social topics. The lesson plans are adaptable to provide a customized learning experience, and each comes with a teacher's guide and a slideshow of recordings, art, documents and other multimedia content. The first Learning Pathway is available here, with additional pathways to be released by the end of 2022.


