The Lewis Prize for Music Announces Inaugural Awards

The Lewis Prize for Music has announced its inaugural awards of \$1.75 million to ten music leaders and their organizations. This recognition and support advances extraordinary work to ensure every young person has access to high-quality music learning, performance and creation opportunities.

Using an innovative tiered approach, The Lewis Prize is giving three \$500,000 Accelerator awards over multiple years as well as four Infusion Awards of \$50,000 for a single year and two Finalist Awards of \$25,000 each for a year.
