Equitable Arts Education Enhancement Act

On July 9, the **Equitable Arts Education Enhancement Act** was introduced to congress to increase access to the arts for underserved communities.

Among other things, the proposed act would:

- Provide financial and other assistance to students in the arts, arts education and cultural departments.
- Establish outreach programs and development offices for arts, arts education and cultural departments.
- Exhibit, maintain, monitor and protect minority art collections in exhibition and in storage.
