### **Executive Order to Reestablish PCAH**

In addition to declaring October 2022 as National Arts and Humanities Month, an Executive Order from the President Biden Administration also includes a directive to reestablish the President's Committee for the Arts and the Humanities (PCAH) over coming months. The committee will be made up of the heads of the three primary federal cultural agencies including the National Endowment for the Arts, as well as up to 25 other non-federal partners.

### **New Report About Black Teaching Artists**

The Black Teaching Artist Lab (BTAL) and Creative Generation have released their collaborative report, A Missing Narrative: Moving Towards Understanding The Black Experience In Teaching Artistry In The U.S.. This report can serve as a foundational point for those who have an interest in furthering the voices of Black teaching artists around the world. With this report, BTAL and Creative Generation encourage all organizations that employ Black-identifying teaching artists to invest more deeply in anti-racist practices, cultural awareness, empathy and sustainable compensation.

## Survey Seeks Information About COVID-19's Effect on Creative Youth Development

Creative Generation is seeking responses in a **new survey** to gather feedback from organizations that fund and provide Creative Youth Development programs. The survey builds on similar work over the past two years to understand the multitude of pandemics impacting arts & cultural education and the response of individuals, programs and communities to these circumstances.



## News From the Field

### **BE BOLD With Misty Copeland Foundation**

The Misty Copeland Foundation (MCF) aims to bring greater diversity, equity and inclusion to dance. The MCF's signature program, BE BOLD, is a free afterschool dance program, that is designed to serve girls and boys, ages 8-10, in community-based, child-focused settings. When talking about the program, Misty Copeland explained, "it was important to me to provide children the same

type of opportunity and environment that helped build a path for me to succeed not just in this artform, but in my life overall."

### **Center for Craft Grants**

The Center for Craft Teaching Artist Cohort will award a dynamic group of 21 mid-career craft artists a one-time, unrestricted grant of \$10,000. The Teaching Artist Cohort will also participate in an 8-month cohort experience where they will be guided through training that encourages and sustains a generative practice as both artists and educators. The Center intends to develop and strengthen a network of craft artists through peer-to-peer learning and connection to enrich the impact on their communities. This grant is free to apply for, and applications are due **Nov. 30**. A free virtual **info session** will be held on Tuesday, Oct. 11, from 4-5 p.m. ET.

## Free Course on Teaching Artistry for Social Impact

International Teaching Artist Collaborative, the first global network of artists who work in schools and communities, has launched its first online course:

Teaching Artistry for Social Impact. This 20-hour course includes experts from around the world teaching how artists can shape their work for learning impact on young and older participants. It includes detailed case studies (several with school students) and guides the student to design their own passion project including all the key elements in best practice. This course is free and asynchronous, with ways to connect to colleagues and a personal coach to polish project work.
