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MEASURING WHAT MATTERS

QUANTITATIVE

- Control and Treatment Pre-Post Surveys for Interns
- Early and Late Writing Samples
- Annual Alumni Survey

QUALITATIVE

- Early and Late Interviews with Interns
- Early and Late Interviews with Supervisors
- Group Interviews with Mentors
- Observations
- Work Samples



10% increase

BAI interns reported a 10% increase in confidence with respect to their verbal communication skills from the start to the end of the program.



20% increase

BAI interns reported a 20% increase in confidence with respect to their written communication skills from the start to the end of the program.



20% increase

BAI interns reported a 10% increase in confidence with respect to their knowledge of arts and culture in their cities from the start to the end of the program.



29% More likely

BAI alums were 29% more likely to enroll in college than their peers.



1 OUT OF 4

Nearly 1 of 4 BAI alums move on to major in the visual or performing arts.
